Offering AA Degrees

Georgia	Technical colleges are authorized to offer only the AAT degree. They do not offer transfer degrees
Kentucky	When Kentucky went through its reorganization in 1998, we created a comprehensive community and technical college system. The community colleges were merged with the technical colleges where they existed and they are now able to offer the AA degree. Where we have only technical colleges, they have been authorized to offer the AA degree as well. It is based on becoming accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and they will have to meet all the same requirements as the Community Colleges.
Maine	As community colleges we do offer Associate in Arts degrees, however, each of our seven colleges also offered Associate in Arts
Mississippi	Mississippi has 15 community and junior colleges that have a career and technical component as a part of their credit offerings, but no colleges or locations that are exclusively career or technical.
Montana	In Montana, all two-year colleges are able to offer an AA degree with Board of Regents approval. Currently, not all two-year colleges have requested approval for this degree.
New Mexico	Degrees prior to changing from technical to community colleges in 2003. comprehensive community colleges in New Mexico
Nevada	All community colleges in Nevada are comprehensive community colleges offering the AA, AS, AB and Associates of Applied Science (vocational in nature)
Vermont	Vermont Technical College offers Associate in Applied Science, Associate in Science, Associate in Engineering and Bachelor of Science degrees. They are not precluded from offering other degrees subject to approval of the Vermont State Colleges Board of Trustees. The B. S. degree was added in 1991
Wyoming	All of Wyoming's community colleges have technical programs, and award AA, AS and AAS degrees as well as technical certificates. We do not have any independent, public technical colleges.
